

## LSSU Recognition of Courses in Sault College's Criminal Justice Programs

### General Information:

- Student must complete at least 124 credits to earn a Bachelor's degree at LSSU.
- 32 of the final 40 credits must be taken there.
- At least half of the 300+ level courses in the Major must be taken at LSSU.
- Student must complete the required courses in the Major, Support and General Education categories.
- To graduate, the student must have an overall G.P.A. of 2.0 or higher and the same in all Major courses.
- There are specific courses in the General Education categories from which the student must choose. **Only those courses** (or their Sault College equivalents) may be counted for General Education purposes.

This means the PFP grad will need to earn at least 37 credits at LSSU in order to earn a CJ degree. (May be more based on specific degree and residency requirements).**
