Mature student applicants may be referred to College Counselling for academic testing and a recommendation from the Counsellor to the Registrar for consideration in their admission. Mature applicants must still submit their high school transcripts and may also be asked for a resume).
Other Information	Students must successfully complete four separate levels of field placement training in various child and family service settings.
